1. October's minutes were read and no changes were recommended. December's agenda was reviewed.
2. 21st CCLC Program Updates from Site Coordinators-Council reviewed the following:
 - a. Grades- 1st nine week grades were reviewed for each site and each site compared and discussed outcomes. Identifying students that are struggling needed to be identified in the Cayen benchmark section. Sites need to target struggling students and monitor their progress.
 - b. Attendance- Attendance is high in each site. High school morning programming is going great. Adjustments had to be made to staffing due to the growing number of students in morning programming.
 - c. North Star Academy, Mustang Round-up Academy and Opportunity Zone will submit Continuation Reports this spring.
 - d. Summer Action Plans were briefly noted.
 - e. Good News-
 - i. All four sites received monitoring visits and each site received Exemplary marks and no areas of non-compliant were found.
 - ii. MRA's Coding Club is a huge and growing success. Students do not want to leave when parents show up to get them and are learning to program design. The club has received recognition from Kentucky Teacher, 21st CCLC website and a local broadcasting system.
 - iii. Opportunity Zone's, "Game of Life" was implemented and is teaching students' classroom economics, which the students can relate to real life situations and the possible outcomes for their decisions.
 - iv. North Star hosted a "Family Dinner Project" night for their students and families and had a large turnout.
 - v. Project Pass has had female and male students win at different levels in Archery Tournaments.

 - Bill Kunnecke discussed the events coming up at West Kentucky Community and Technical College.
 - Starting a girls mentoring program this spring which will include a Maker Space.
 - LEGO Robotics Tournament for 4th-8th grade also coming in March.
