DATA NOTES:

All data retrieved from Cayen Systems on September 17th, 2012.

Site level data are compared to aggregate data for all KY 21st CCLC “Elementary School” or “Middle/High School” sites based on the proportion of student attendees in grades Pre-K through 6 and grades 7 through 12.

“Elementary School” sites are those in which at least 50% of students served were in grades Pre-K through 6. “Middle/High” Sites are sites in which at least 50% of students served were in grades 7 through 12.

Demographic and outcome measures are calculated for regular participants that have data. For example, if lunch status is unknown the participant was excluded from the analysis of “Percent regular participants eligible for free/reduced lunch.”

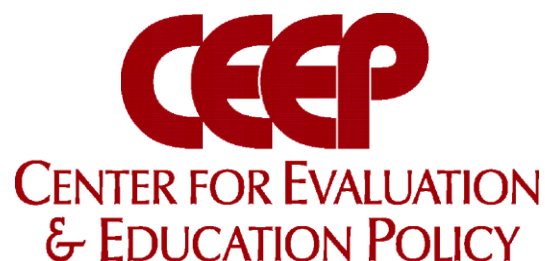
*The percent of students who earned the highest grade possible in both the fall and spring grading periods.
